Subject:- Grant of Conditional Permission to Patanjali Bhartiya Ayurvigyan Evam Anusandhan Sansthan Patanjali Yogpeeth, Phase-I Delhi-Haridwar National Highway Near Bahadrabd, Haridwar-249405 Uttarakhand (Inst. ID-AYU0243) with 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 63 seats in 09 PG courses in the subject namely – (i) Ayurved Samhita, Sanskrit & Siddhant- 05 seats (ii) Kriya Sharir- 05 seats (iii) Dravyaguna Vigyana-05 seats (iv) Rasa Shastra & Bhaishajya Kalpana-05 seats (v) Kaumarbhritya-Bala Roga-06 seats (vi) Shalya Tantra-07 seats (vii) Shalakya Tantra-10 seats (viii) Kayachikitsa-10 seats (ix) Panchkarma-10 seats under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2024-25 and relevant regulations thereunder-reg.

#### Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provision of National commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act,1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-division (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) shall stand dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby notifies that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021 and as per regulation 59 (2) of The National Commission for Indian System of Medicine ACT, 2020, Medical standards, requirements and other provisions of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 and the rules and regulations made there under shall continue to be in force and operate till new standards or requirements are specified under this Act or the rules and regulations made there under.

Further, the provision of concerned regulations which are inconsistent with the provision of NCISM Act, 2020 shall not be applicable.

- 1. Further, to assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, Hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely Patanjali Bhartiya Ayurvigyan Evam Anusandhan Sansthan Patanjali Yogpeeth, Phase-I Delhi-Haridwar National Highway Near Bahadrabd, Haridwar-249405 Uttarakhand (Inst. ID-AYU0243) inspection of your College was conducted on 19.02.2024 & 20.02.2024 on Hybrid mode as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Asessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process the Conditional permission with 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 63 seats in 09 PG courses in the subject namely (i) Ayurved Samhita, Sanskrit & Siddhant- 05 seats (ii) Kriya Sharir- 05 seats (iii) Dravyaguna Vigyana-05 seats (iv) Rasa Shastra & Bhaishajya Kalpana-05 seats (v) Kaumarbhritya-Bala Roga-06 seats (vi) Shalya Tantra-07 seats (vii) Shalakya Tantra-10 seats (viii) Kayachikitsa-10 seats (ix) Panchkarma-10 seats under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2024-25.
- 2. Further, the visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of the enforced regulations namely, the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016" "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Post-graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations 2016", provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under. On careful examination of the assessment report following shortcoming/defect have been observed-
- a) Availability of teaching staff is  $\frac{Available}{Required} x 100\% = \frac{43}{45} x 100\% = 95.5\%$  which is not fulfilling the criteria as per Sub Regulation (1) (a) of Regulation 8 and Schedule-V of MSR 2016.
- b) Shortcomings of teaching staffs is as under:-

a) Availability of hospital staff is  $\frac{Available}{Required}x100\% = \frac{107}{112}x100\% = 95.5\%$  (As per the available beds in the college) which is not fulfilling the criteria as per Schedule-IV of MSR 2016.

- 3. As per the direction of the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM), the assessment report was placed in the 82<sup>nd</sup> Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on 08.03.2024 and Board concluded that the college is not fulfilling the notified & approved criteria, but fulfilling the criteria required for issuance of conditional permission as mentioned in Regulation 3, and as per the note mentioned in Schedule-IV, Schedule-V and Schedule-VI of MSR 2016. Hence, Board decided to issue the Conditional permission with 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 63 seats in 09 PG courses in the subject namely (i) Ayurved Samhita, Sanskrit & Siddhant-05 seats (ii) Kriya Sharir- 05 seats (iii) Dravyaguna Vigyana-05 seats (iv) Rasa Shastra & Bhaishajya Kalpana-05 seats (v) Kaumarbhritya-Bala Roga-06 seats (vi) Shalya Tantra-07 seats (vii) Shalakya Tantra-10 seats (viii) Kayachikitsa-10 seats (ix) Panchkarma-10 seats under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2024-25.
- 4. Therefore, conditional permission is issued to Patanjali Bhartiya Ayurvigyan Evam Anusandhan Sansthan Patanjali Yogpeeth, Phase-I Delhi-Haridwar National Highway Near Bahadrabd, Haridwar-249405 Uttarakhand (Inst. ID-AYU0243) with 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 63 seats in 09 PG courses in the subject namely (i) Ayurved Samhita, Sanskrit & Siddhant-05 seats (ii) Kriya Sharir- 05 seats (iii) Dravyaguna Vigyana-05 seats (iv) Rasa Shastra & Bhaishajya Kalpana-05 seats (v) Kaumarbhritya-Bala Roga-06 seats (vi) Shalya Tantra-07 seats (vii) Shalakya Tantra-10 seats (viii) Kayachikitsa-10 seats (ix) Panchkarma-10 seats under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2024-25 subject to the condition that aforementioned shortcoming shall be fulfilled along with the following requirements: -
  - I. The college shall submit an undertaking in the form of affidavit duly notarized within one month explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, non-teaching staff of the Colleges/Hospitals and regularly paying the same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948 and relevant Rules and Regulations.
  - II. It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity with 100 seats and 15% of post-graduate seats of the permitted intake capacity with 63 seats in 09 PG courses shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central

Government for A.Y. 2024-25 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.

- III. It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatary Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
- 5. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
- 6. Further, as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.
- 7. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- 8. The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2024 and compliance report should be sent to get permission for the academic session 2025-2026:
  - All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;
  - ii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Post graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016;
  - iii) All the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Ayurveda).
  - iv) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto.
  - v) The shortcoming mentioned in Para no. 2 above, should be fulfilled.
  - vi) All the requirements under the provisions of the new MES regulations of NCISM which come into force before 31st December 2024 shall be fulfilled.
- 9. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2025-26.
