#### Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provision of National commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act,1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-division (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) shall stand dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by subsection (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby notifies that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021.

- I am to refer to your application vide ref. no. PAC/933, PAC/1036 dated 07.10.2022 & 14.11.2022, on the subject cited above and to verify the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff and other facilities available at your college namely Patanjali Bhartiya Ayurvigyan Evam Anusandhan Sansthan Patanjali Yogpeeth, Phase-I Delhi-Haridwar National Highway Near Bahadrabd, Haridwar-249405 Uttarakhand (Inst. ID-AYU0243) to Start 03 New PG courses with 18 Seats in the subject namely :-(i) Swasthavrita evam yoga-06 seats (ii) Kaumarbhartiya-06 Seats (iii) Stri evam Prasuti Tantra-06 Seats & for increase intake capacity in existing 04 PG Courses in the subject namely (i) Kaya Chikitsa- 05 to 10 Seats (ii) Shalya Tantra-05 to 10 Seats (iii) Shalakya Tantra -05 to 10 Seats (iv) Panchkarma-05 to 10 Seats under section 29 of NCISM Act 2020 from the academic session 2023-24, visitation has been carried out for issuance of Letter of Intent on 20-04-2023 & 21-04-2023 through hybrid mode by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board (NCISM) and as you were fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria, accordingly Letter of Intent (LOI) has been issued to your college vide letter of even no. dated 20.05.2023.
- Further, inspection of your College was again conducted on 27.07.2023 & 28.07.2023 on Hybrid mode as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and rating Board, NCISM to process for issuance of Conditional permission with intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 40 seats in 08 PG courses in the subject namely (i) Ayurveda Samhita and sidhant-05 seats (ii) Kriya Sharir-05 seats (iii) Dravyaguna Vigyana-05 seats (iv) Rasa Shastra & Bhaishajya Kalpana -05 seats (v) Kayachikitsa – 05 seats (vi) Shalya Tantra - 05 seats (vii) Shalakya Tantra - 05 seats

(viii) Panchkarma – 05 seats under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and for issuance of Letter of permission to start 03 new PG courses with 18 seats in the subject namely (i) Prasuti and Stri Roga -06 seats (ii) Swasthvritta -06 seats (iii) Kaumarbhritya -06 seats and increase of seats in 04 existing PG courses in the subject namely (i) Kayachikitsa –from 05 to 10 seats (ii) Shalya Tantra - from 05 to 10 seats (iii) Shalakya Tantra - from 05 to 10 seats (iv) Panchakarma - from 05 to 10 seats from the academic session 2023-24 under Section 29 of NCISM ACT 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder.

3. Further, in view of above, the visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulation namely, the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", "Indian Medicine Central Council (Post-graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016" and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under. On examining the case in light of above notified and approved criteria and on perusal of the visitation report, it was observed that the college was not fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria due to following shortcomings: -

- 4. In view of above, the assessment report was placed in the 55<sup>th</sup> Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) on 25.08.2023. On careful examination of the assessment report, considering the deficiencies observed therein as mentioned above the college was given an opportunity of virtual hearing vide the MARBISM letter (Hearing notice) of even no. dated 29.08.2023 to appear on 01.09.2023 and same was rescheduled on 02.09.2023 before the designated Hearing Committee to present their case and to show cause as to why not the conditional permission to your college with 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 40 seats in 08 PG courses in the subjects namely (i) Ayurveda Samhita and sidhant-05 seats (ii) Kriya Sharir-05 seats (iii) Dravyaguna Vigyana-05 seats (iv) Rasa Shastra & Bhaishajya Kalpana -05 seats (v) Kayachikitsa - 05 seats (vi) Shalya Tantra - 05 seats (vii) Shalakya Tantra - 05 seats (viii) Panchkarma - 05 seats under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and for issuance of Letter of permission to start 03 new PG courses with 18 seats in the subject namely (i) Prasuti and Stri Roga -06 seats (ii) Swasthvritta -06 seats (iii) Kaumarbhritya -06 seats and increase of seats in 04 existing PG courses in the subject namely (i) Kayachikitsa -from 05 to 10 seats (ii) Shalya Tantra - from 05 to 10 seats (iii) Shalakya Tantra from 05 to 10 seats (iv) Panchakarma - from 05 to 10 seats under section 29 of NCISM Act 2020 be denied for the Academic Year 2023-24. The representatives of the college submitted written submissions vide letter no. PAC/455 dated 31.08.2023 against the deficiencies conveyed to them.
- 5. Whereas, the college through its representatives, Dr. Anil Kumar, Principal and Dr. Girish K.J. Vice Principal appeared before the Hearing Committee on 02.09.2023 and made their submission virtually as well as written submission against the shortcomings communicated to the college. The shortcomings communicated to the college, submission made by the representatives of the Ayurveda college and observations made by the Hearing Committee are as under: -

She has paid required fee to Registrar, Bhartiya Chikitsa Parishad 22-Aug-2022. Uttarakhand on Receipt of the same has been attached for your kind perusal. We anticipate her state registration certificate from Bhartiya Chikitsa Parishad, Uttarakhand in week time. (Annexure-1A1-9) We would also like to bring to your

It is observed that there is no relevance for this hearing.

- 6. The observation of hearing committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and assessment report of the NCISM have been carefully re-examined in terms of Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", "Indian Medicine Central Council (Post-graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016" and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder, and once again as per the direction of President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM), the recommendation of Hearing Committee was placed in the 57<sup>th</sup> Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Song 2023.

As per sub regulation (7) of Regulation 6 of PG MSR Ayurveda 2016, The minimum additional teaching staff required for starting post-graduate course shall be one Professor or Reader and one Lecturer of the concerned subject, in addition to the teachers stipulated for under-graduate teaching, and the specialty which does not exist as independent department at under-graduate level shall have minimum one Professor or Reader and one Lecturer for starting post-graduate course.

As per sub regulation (8) of Regulation 6 of *PG MSR Ayurveda 2016*, the post-graduate department or specialty shall have minimum one Professor in concerned subject or specialty from the academic session 2017-18.

a) <u>In the Department of Prasuti Tantra & Stri Roga</u>. As, college is having 05 eligible teaching faculty in the Department of Prasuti Tantra & Stri Roga (01 Associate Professor & 02 Assistant Professors for UG course and 01 Associate Professor & 01 Assistant Professor for PG course) and **There is non availability of 01 professor in the concerned subject which is mandatory as per sub regulation (8) of regulation 6 of (PG Ayurveda Education) Regulation 2016 and is not fulfilling the criteria for issuance of permission to start new PG course in the department of Prasuti tantra & Stri Roga.** 

**b)** In the Department of Swasthavritta- As, college is having 04 eligible teaching faculty in the Department of Swasthvritta (01 Professor, 01 Associate Professor & 01 Assistant Professor for UG course and 01 Associate Professor for PG course) and There is non availability of 01 additional lower faculty in the concerned subject which is mandatory as per sub regulation (7) of regulation 6 of (PG Ayurveda Education) Regulation 2016 and is not fulfilling the criteria for issuance of permission to start new PG course in the department of Swasthvritta.

c) In the Department of Shalya Tantra - As per sub regulation 1 of regulation 16 of (PG Ayurveda Education) Regulation 2016, The teacher-student ratio shall be such that the number of post-graduate teachers to the number of post-graduate students admitted per year is maintained as 1:3 in case of Professor and 1:2 in case of Reader or Associate Professor and as per sub regulation 2 of regulation 16 of (PG Ayurveda Education) Regulation 2016, the teacher student ratio shall be 1:1 in case of Lecturer or Assistant Professor having minimum of five years teaching experience.

As, college is having 05 eligible teaching faculty in the **department of Shalya Tantra** (01 Professor, 01 Associate Professor & 01 Assistant Professor for UG course and 01 Associate Professor & 01 Assistant Professor for PG course) and there is shortcoming of 01 additional professor in Shalya Tantra PG department for fulfilling the teacher student ratio and as per the available faculty, college is not fulfilling the teacher student ratio are of LOP and **is eligible for issuance of permission for seat increase from 05 to 07 seats [instead of 05 seats to 10 seats]** in the department of Shalya Tantra.

Therefore, Board decided to issue conditional permission with intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 40 seats in 08 PG courses in the subject namely (i) Ayurveda Samhita and sidhant-05 seats (ii) Kriya Sharir-05 seats (iii) Dravyaguna Vigyana-05 seats (iv) Rasa Shastra & Bhaishajya Kalpana -05 seats (v) Kayachikitsa – 05 seats (vi) Shalya Tantra - 05 seats (vii) Shalakya Tantra - 05 seats (viii) Panchkarma – 05 seats under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and for issuance of Letter of permission for increase of seats in 04 existing PG courses in the subject namely (i) Kayachikitsa – from 05 to 10 seats (ii) Shalya Tantra - from 05 to 07 seats [instead of 05 to 10 seats] (iii) Shalakya Tantra - from 05 to 10 seats (iv) Panchakarma - from 05 to 10 seats and to start 01 new PG course with 06 seats in the subject namely (i) Kaumarbhritya -06 seats and Denial of Letter of Permission to start 02 new PG courses with 12 seats in the subject namely (i) Swasthavrita evam yoga-06 seats (ii) Prasuti Tantra evam Stri Roga -06 Seats from the academic session 2023-24 under Section 29 of NCISM ACT 2020.

- 8. Further, in accordance of the regulation 6(3)(j)(iii) and 6(2)(i)(i) of "Establishment of New Medical College, Opening of New or Higher Course of Study or Training and Increase of Admission Capacity by a Medical College Regulations, 2019 vide letter of even no. dated 06.09.2023 a letter was sent to you to furnish fixed security deposit worth Rs. 50 lakhs (Fifty Lakhs) by way of a demand draft or online payment to start 01 new PG course with 06 seats and Rs. 85 lakhs (Eighty Five Lakhs) for increase of seats in 04 existing PG courses in favor of National Commission fund for Indian system of Medicine for the period of five years. In response of the same you have furnished the fixed security deposit in favor of the National Commission fund for Indian system of Medicine through Cheque No. 89164 and 89165 dated 11.09.2023 of Rupees 01 Crore 35 Lakh Only transferred by SBI, Haridwar (for a period of three years) and informed the same vide email dated 12.09.2023.
- 9. Therefore, <u>Conditional Permission</u> is issued to Patanjali Bhartiya Ayurvigyan Evam Anusandhan Sansthan Patanjali Yogpeeth, Phase-I Delhi-Haridwar National Highway Near Bahadrabd,

Haridwar-249405 Uttarakhand (Inst. ID-AYU0243) with intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 40 seats in 08 PG courses in the subject namely (i) Ayurveda Samhita and sidhant-05 seats (ii) Kriya Sharir-05 seats (iii) Dravyaguna Vigyana-05 seats (iv) Rasa Shastra & Bhaishajya Kalpana -05 seats (v) Kayachikitsa – 05 seats (vi) Shalya Tantra - 05 seats (vii) Shalakya Tantra - 05 seats (viii) Panchkarma – 05 seats under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and for issuance of Letter of permission for increase of seats in 04 existing PG courses in the subject namely (i) Kayachikitsa – from 05 to 10 seats (ii) Shalya Tantra - from 05 to 07 seats [instead of 05 to 10 seats] (iii) Shalakya Tantra - from 05 to 10 seats (iv) Panchakarma – from 05 to 10 seats and to start 01 new PG course with 06 seats in the subject namely (i) Kaumarbhritya -06 seats and Denial of Letter of Permission to start 02 new PG courses with 12 seats in the subject namely (i) Swasthavrita evam yoga-06 seats (ii) Prasuti Tantra evam Stri Roga -06 Seats from the academic session 2023-24 under Section 29 of NCISM ACT 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder.

- (i) The college shall submit an undertaking in the form of affidavit duly notarized within one month explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, non-teaching staff of the Colleges/Hospitals and regularly paying the same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948 and relevant Rules and Regulations.
- (ii) It is further informed that 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 100 seats and 15% of post graduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 63 seats in 09 PG courses shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2023-24 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.
- (iii) It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
- 10. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
- 11. Further, as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.
- 12. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- 13. The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2023 **and send a compliance report to get permission for the academic session 2024-2025**:
  - (i) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;
  - (ii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for post-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;
  - (iii) All the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Ayurveda);
  - (iv) all the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto;
- 14. This permission for increase of seats in 04 existing PG courses in the subject namely (i) Kayachikitsa –from 05 to 10 seats (ii) <u>Shalya Tantra - from 05 to 07 seats [instead of 05 to 10 seats]</u> (iii) Shalakya Tantra - from 05 to 10 seats (iv) Panchakarma - from 05 to 10 seats and to start 01 new PG course with 06 seats in the subject namely (i) Kaumarbhritya -06 seats from the academic session 2023-24 as stated above for the first admitted batch of 2023-24 session, will be valid till such time as the first batch of students admitted against these courses appear

for the first final examination of the said courses and at that time, the College authorities may take up the matter for recognition of the qualifications under Section 35 of the NCISM Act 2020.

- 15. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2024-25.
